The stations can be rapidly transported and set-up in the battlefield and report back to the command post via a license free radio (5-7 miles).

These stations are designed specifically to meet the demands of tactical military use. Built around the well versed WEATHERPAK[®], these systems are extremely rugged, accurate, reliable, and able to withstand the rigors associated with military missions and deployments for many years.

Portable Tactical Stations are different from Portable Stations alone, as they are usually tasked with more measurements (air support, for

example), rougher handling (thrown out of a military vehicle), and multiple types of data being sent to several different users. They are often referred to as "trans-portable," meaning they should travel by vehicle - not in someone's backpack. Some versions may require AC power for 24/7 operations, while others may be specifically designed to run on battery-only power. A key feature is that they are quickly deployable in any environment, anywhere on earth.



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Measurements include: wind speed and direction, dew point, pressure, temperature, visibility, cloud height, precipitation identification, precipitation amount, and lightning detection. Software can be LINUX or Windows® and is fully ICAO/FMH-1/WMO compliant. User Interface is simple to use and intuitive.

The lightning detector can be used either in conjunction with the system, or as a stand-alone sensor system, allowing a more flexible deployment.

The systems compute METAR, SPECI and SYNOP formats.

The U.S. Navy, U.S. Air Force, NWS, FAA, and Swedish, French, Polish, Mexican and Peruvian Militaries all rely on Coastal Environmental Systems' Aviation Weather Stations for their weather data and reporting needs.
